Pupils to be advised of the potential for contact between event stations were encouraged to avoid this as part of the initial briefing. Pupils will be briefed to ensure they socially distance when not playing and areas will be clearly marked to ensure schools are separated. Breaks in activity will be provided for sanitising of equipment where appropriate
